Next, Fabiani passed out information on serving veterans, especially those who have been wounded in action, to help them re-integrate into the community workforce. He felt the Optimist Club might play a role.

Then Fabiani presented the crux of a long-term plan he envisions for our club. This is a forerunner to remarks he has been preparing for his November 2<sup>nd</sup> talk before 18 middle school principals. He sees our club building on 9 years of JOOI Club organizing experience, starting with the Randolph Club, and most recently with Grace Lutheran. Currently he is working with Whitesburg Middle School to be our 5th junior club. **T**eams of 2 experienced Optimists could be assigned to each JOOI Club to meet with them monthly. This is the **T** in his **ACT** acronym. **A** is for **A**ttitude, and **C** is for **C**ommitment. Furthermore, to ensure success he proposes to get a new club up and going by providing a banner, gavel, and bell; and to pay their dues for two years; and to take a student representative of each club to a District meeting once each year to meet with other young people from around the District. He recognizes there is a cost involved, but the spread of Optimism in this way will, in the long run, enhance the value of our club to the community.

Following Fabiani's impassioned and enthusiastic vision, Jim Berry moved to wholly adopt this plan. Alberto seconded. There was discussion about the source of funding. Since some thought the HOF (Huntsville Optimist Foundation) would end up with the bill and there would be a problem with possibly interpreting parts of the plan as scholarships which violate the HOF charter of no scholarships in order to retain its tax exempt status. I hope I have fairly reported the club's and the HOF's positions. Jim Berry's motion passed with the funding source to be determined.
