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## **Opening**

In lieu of our usual 3-course gourmet lunch, we were allowed to choose any sandwich from the menu. This resulted in our having the program first and the lunch later, but did not take away from a very enjoyable meeting.

Dr. Sandridge opened the meeting with prayer. It was Flag Day, but the DHI did not have an American flag set up for us. Nonetheless, we said the Pledge of Allegiance with great gusto.

# **Program**

Duane Plank introduced today's speaker, Sheriff Blake Dorning. Sheriff Dorning reminded us of the several topics he had addressed in previous Club speaking engagements: Technology Implementation, Home Land Security Responsibilities, and the New Jail. Today he spoke the Sheriff's Department's programs for young people.

The newest youth program is the "Texting While Driving" program being given to high school sophomores and juniors. Using a specially modified SUV, students compare their driving performance driving a defined course when not distracted to that when texting. The program also teaches

Another kid-friendly program being taught during the school year is teaching Integrity and Character to middle school students.

Besides teaching programs, the Sheriff's Department conducts fund-raising programs for various youth sports teams (the ones who ask). They have cooked mountains of pork butts and chicken halves as fund raisers.

The Sheriff's Department currently has 2 full-time deputies to track down sexual predators on children, and another to keep up with the locations of registered sex offenders in the County.

Sheriff Dorning closed by answered several questions from the floor concerning computer safety, on-going training, his budget condition, supplementary fund sources, and the effects of the immigration law. He said two technology tools have been very helpful to his deputies: In-car video cameras record of all traffic stops, and the use of "red-dot compliance" Tasers allows disarming threatening bad guys without shooting them. The Sheriff reported that there are now 114 Deputies on patrol and 165 Correction Officers in the Department.
