

Jim Berry gave the invocation which included a moment of silence for the parents of the school children killed in Newtown, CT. Clyde Nevins led in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Opening

President Tom Casteel opened the meeting by reading a poem by Edgar Guest entitled "At Christmas." The gist of the poem is that at Christmas time people are most like what God would have them be all year round.

Alberto asked permission to make two short announcements. First he thanked all those in the Club who had attended one of the Living Christmas Tree performances. Then he announced that yesterday was the 80th birthday of your editor, and "Happy Birthday" was sung for him.

Sick Call

There were several faithful members absent from today's meeting due to illness. These were reported as follows:

Milt Williams has been in the hospital for treatment of two blood clots, one of which was in his lung and affected his breathing. The clots came as an aftereffect of his recent surgery for varicose veins. He is due out of the hospital today (Thursday).

George McDonough has been suffering from "the crud" and has been homebound for a few days.

Zack Thompson has his right arm in a sling, the result of a shoulder injury that required surgery. It was reported that Zack's injury was a result of falling out of a tree stand during one of his hunts.

Fabiani Duarte reported his head is doing fine, and he will have the 5 staples holding his scalp together removed today.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Al Renz walked the club through the various line items of the Income and Expense Statement for the first two month's of this fiscal year. The only expenditures thus far have been for our youth programs, the Band Instrument Program and the JOOI Club Program. The largest expenses were for our monthly band repair contract with Robbins Music, and for purchasing 750 JOOI Club pins. Al reported there is now less than \$200 due for delinquent memberships.

Al briefly recapped the situation with Jeff Klimek. The Club has been asked to prepare an "Impact Statement" for the court, as we are his principal victim. Should Jeff seek a plea bargain to reduce any imposed prison sentence, this statement would guide the court on what, if any reduction in payment to the club could be exchanged for a reduced sentence. Jeff's arraignment is still scheduled for February 28, 2013. Al said he has 10 Optimist Club shirts, with all sizes still available, for sale at \$15 each. All funds received for the shirts go to the Club treasury. Tom Casteel added that he has two Optimist aprons for sale at \$13 each, as well.

President Tom Casteel proposed that the Club send out a majority of the dues bills by e-mail, with essentially the same distribution as now get their Opti-Topics digitally. This would save the Club a few bucks over the course of a year. The only discussion was a suggestion that the subject line of such an e-mail clearly state the subject as "Optimist Club Dues." There being no negative comments or opposition, Tom said the e-mail dues statements would begin starting with the upcoming quarter.

JOOI Clubs

Committee Chairman Fabiani Duarte reported that December has been a very busy month for installing JOOI Club officers. Six Clubs, Randolph HS, Ed White MS, Davis Hills MS, Chapman MS, Whitesburg MS, and Morris Elementary School all held installations. He thanked all the Optimist members who had participated in the various events.

Combined with the two installations in November (University Place Elementary School and Hazel Green HS), the Hampton Cove MS installation scheduled in January, and Sparkman HS Club looking like it will reactivate, the Club's commitment to youth in our community and county are becoming well known. Lee High School is the next school targeted for a JOOI Club, and the principal there is supportive.

President Tom said that there is a national contest among all Optimist Clubs for starting JOOI Clubs, and he opined that our Club could be leading.

There is potential for our Club partnering with Semper Fi in providing liaison with our JOOI Clubs. Semper Fi has available manpower and interest in youth activities, but have had difficulties getting into schools. Tom and Fabiani will pursue this potential and report back to the Club.

Tri-Star Basketball

Committee Chairman Jesse Lang reported that everything is set for the contest to be held on Saturday, January 19, except for ordering the trophies. He asked Al Renz if he would take care of this again this year, and Al agreed to do so. Optimists are asked to be at the ORC at 9:00 a. m. on the day of the contest. Tom had printed up flyers, and these are being distributed to our JOOI Clubs and to schools. The flyer includes an application form for contestants.

Essay Contest,

Committee Chairman Al Renz reported that he has either e-mailed or sent letters to all past contestants who are still eligible advising them of this year's contest. George McDonough and he are contacting schools and JOOI Clubs to spread the word about entering the contest. The deadline for entries is January 31, 2013.

Oratorical Contest,

Committee Chairman Alberto Duarte reported that at least two options for the location of the contest are being considered: The Cooper House, and a new facility at the First Baptist Church. March 9, 2013 is the latest date for holding the contest. He next proposed that the prize money for the winning speeches be increased to \$300 (now \$200) for first, \$200 (now \$100) for second, and \$100 (now \$50) for third. He stated that the effort in preparing and delivering a speech is much greater than preparing an essay, and the prize money should reflect this difference.

Tom asked if his proposal was a motion, and Alberto said yes. Jim Berry seconded the motion. The discussion centered around where the money would come from, especially whether the additional money needed would come from other programs such as our Community Outreach. Tom said that if the motion passed, the Board would consider how to revamp the budget to make the money available. The Board's decision would be reported back to the membership for approval.

Other New Business

Buddy Beck asked if there has been any move for our Club to join with the Noon Optimist Club which has suffered a severe decline in membership. Tom said he knows the president well, and he will initiate discussions.

Closing

Before closing, a round of applause was given to Gay Pepper and Jim Berry for putting on an outstanding Christmas party—one of the best ones in recent memory. A round of applause was also given for Jim and Peggy Otto for providing the entertainment at the party.

Carl Winkler led in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.
