Program



Program Chairman Al Renz introduced our speaker for today, Jason Simpson, Chief Meteorologist at Channel 19 in Huntsville. Jason has been at Channel 19 since January, 2012, having come from ABC 30/40 in Birmingham. He is staunch advocate for science education in the classroom and was instrumental in building the

curriculum for elementary and middle school science classes called the "ABC's of Weather."

Jason began by saying he enjoys very much speaking to civic groups and clubs such as ours, but few matched the welcoming environment he received today. He said he is available if there is any way he can help our Club in its youth programs.

Jason's interesting and informative talk covered the history of tornadoes in the Huntsville/Madison County area. Since 1951 there have been 67 tornadoes, including three EF-5's and two EF-4's. He said there are two statistical "hot spots" for tornadoes to occur: Harvest, in NW Madison County, and Airport Road in Huntsville. He said there is good evidence that topography of our county is a significant factor in why these hot spots occur, but it is not proven. Geography also pays a big role in why tornadoes are formed in this part of the U. S., since this is where the moist air from the Gulf and the cold air from Canada frequently clash.

Jason advocated everyone follow three rules to keep safe in our tornado-prone environment:

- (1) Be prepared,
- (2) Know the "enemy"
- (3) Use common sense and good judgment.

Everyone should have either a weather radio or an app on their smart phone or I-pad. Channel 19 has a free "Live Alert" download that includes a call to your smart phone.

If you live in a historically tornado prone area, invest in an underground tornado shelter. Jason said there is much work to be done to help and inform those who live in mobile home parks.

If a tornado warning is issued, stay calm; go to the lowest and most central location in your home. Do not make unnecessary cell phone calls to prevent overloading towers and inhibiting critical phone calls—use texting if at all possible.

Jason fielded several questions covering whether man influenced global warning, the meteorological cause of "microbursts," the interaction of TV weathermen with the local U. S. Weather Service Office and the competition between Huntsville's TV weathermen.

Jason closed his talk by repeating his offer to help the club where he is able.

Closing

Our speaker drew Byrom Goodwin's name on the first draw. Dr. Carl Winkler led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.


