#### Opening

Twenty two Optimists turned out for our monthly business meeting at the Optimist Research Center today. In the absence of President Tom Casteel, Vice President George McDonough called the meeting to order. Rev. Jim Berry, who is recovering from recent shoulder joint replacement surgery, gave the invocation. Jim Otto led the Club in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Due to late arrival of our lunches today (Tim Vander Veer was held up at a railroad crossing), George elected to begin the business meeting before eating.

#### **Financial Report**



Club Treasurer Al Renz distributed the financial report for October 1, 2012 through May 31, 2013, and reviewed the highlights from the report. Our support of youth programs resulted in expenses of over

\$22,000 dollars for the period, all of which was reimbursed from the Optimist Foundation.

As of today, our bank balance is about \$4,200 which includes recent dues payments, Foundation reimbursements, and credit card rebates.

Al reported he had received an e-mail from the Department of Justice on the status of Jeff Klimek. Jeff is now incarcerated in the Federal Penitentiary at Maxwell AFB in Montgomery, AL. He is due to be released November 1, after which, providing he finds a job, he will begin repaying the over \$65,000 due the Club. **Optimist Foundation** President Bill Clarke reported that the Foundation's account at Regions had grown from \$809,736 at the beginning of May to \$812,300 by May 31. He cautioned,

however, that the market in June has been trending downward.
