#### **Today's Meeting Mullins Restaurant**

#### **Program**

This month's Program Chairman, Jim Roe, introduced our two speakers from **Athens State University** today. First up was **Guy McClure**, Director of Marketing, Public Relations and Publications at Athens State.

Mr. McClure began by saying he is a native of Huntsville. He said he remembered when Mullins restaurant was a drive-in across the street when he was a boy. His father was an Optimist in the Athens Club. He asked how many of those present had been to the Athens State campus outside of attending the Fiddlers Contest that is held each October to raise money for scholarships (I saw very few hands).

Mr. McClure presented some interesting facts about Athens State. It was founded in 1822, and is the oldest university of higher learning in the state of Alabama. The university has held non-stop classes since then, including through the Civil War. It has an enrollment of a little over 3,000 students, of which the majority are working and/or are married. It claims to provide the best education at the lowest cost per hour in the state.

One unique fact is that Athens State University is one of only five universities in the world that have *only* junior and senior students. In fact, there is no name for such a university (they tried "junior college," but that didn't work). He's trying to come up with a term.

Recently, Athens State has begun two new programs. The first is an undergraduate degree in Information Technology Assurance. This degree will equip students to combat hackers. The second new program is a graduate level program in Global Logistics and Resupply. It will be the first graduate level program at Athens State. Another graduate level program approved, but not yet implemented, will be in Religion and Ethics.

He invited any or all of our Club to come to the university and take a tour of the campus.

Our next speaker from Athens State University was Ms. **Kim Bell**. She is the Interim Director of the Athens State Center for Lifelong Learning, and a Professor of Business Statistics at the university. Ms. Bell said she, too, has had ties to Optimist Clubs. She reported that in 1989 she was named the Optimist Club Teenager of the Year.

Ms. Bell told us about a special part of Athens State University, the Lifelong Learning department, now in its fifth year at the university. This department is designed to fill a variety of needs for both adults and younger students. Most of the classes are not-for-credit, although the department does teach several certification classes for professional development.

There are the typical classes for adult interests like cake decoration and flower arrangement, but the most popular classes are in leisure travel. They have led overseas trips to Greece and Israel and to domestic destinations like Yellowstone National Park and the Tennessee Aquarium. One future trip she is looking forward to is to Music City Ranch in Montana. The Lifelong Learning classes for young people include music lessons in cello, violin, piano, guitar and song writing.

The university is open to suggestion for new classes to become part of the Lifelong Learning department. Any subject that aims for the general good and offers personal improvement could be included.

#### **Question and Answer Session**

- **Q.** Jim Roe asked if the university offered off-campus classes.
- **A.** Yes, both on-line classes and face-to-face classes to groups are available.
- **Q.** Alberto Duarte asked if classes were available for all ages.
- A. Yes (see above)
- Q. Alberto Duarte asked if there needed to be ties to the school to take the Lifelong Learning classes.
- **A.** No, the classes were open to anyone.
- **Q.** Alberto Duarte asked what the duration of classes was.
- **A.** Some were as little as half a day; some as long as 6 months. The length of instruction depends on the subject matter.
- **Q.** Alberto Duarte asked if there were any language classes included in the Lifelong Learning program.
- **A.** Thus far, only one, a Conversational Spanish class, has been offered. However, the University's Interim, President, Dr. Engle, has asked Ms. Bell to put on a multicultural event by May of 2016.

#### Closing

President Al gave a tile with the Optimist Creed on them to each of our speakers. Since both had Optimist ties, he said "You should know it." Ms. Bell drew a name for our attendance prize, and the first name drawn was **Dr. Sidney Sandridg**e. President Al remarked that "This has got to be a setup."

Dr. Carl Winkler led us in the reciting the Optimist Creed.


