Program

Jim Roe introduced our speaker for the day, Tom Brocher, Outreach Chair for LearningQUEST, an all-volunteer organization offering lifelong learning educational and enrichment programs for adults of all ages.

LearningQUEST is based in Huntsville and has about 250 members.

Tom stated that he had won an Optimist Oratorical contest as a teenager in Florida. He said that he still has the medal. He also said that he heard about our Band Instrument program and appreciates that we are providing young people the ability to participate in music education.

LearningQUEST has two semesters a year, a Spring semester (January – June) and a Fall semester (January – June). There are approximately 55 courses each semester, some meet 1 time, some 4 times. Classes are held on weekdays during the daytime.

Membership in LearningQUEST is \$10 a year plus a \$25 course fee each semester. You may as many courses as you desire each semester as long as space is available.

LearningQUEST has three functions:

Education

There are a large variety of courses offered, crafts, languages, cooking, history, art, etc. Check out the catalog on line or attend Rally Day to obtain a hard copy.

Excursions

Excursions are usually day trips to local venues, although sometimes there might be an overnight trip. These events are self supporting.

Social

While the main emphasis is on education we do have some social events. There is an annual picnic and Rally Day. Rally Day is held at the First Baptist Church Life Center, St. Clair entrance #7, Tuesday, July 26, 2016, 9:30-11:30


