Club Visit to the June 7 Optimist Club meeting. He needs at least four from our Club to go for us to garner the A & A points for the visit. Several volunteered at the meeting.

Treasurer's Report



Treasurer Al Renz distributed his financial report for the 7 months ending April 30, 2017. He remarked there was "not a whole lot of difference" from the previous month, with the net gain (revenue less expenses) for the month up a mere \$110 from the end of March. New expenses for Youth Activities (over and above those for the normal Band Instrument

program) were \$100 for our sponsorship of a Huntsville entry into the Optimist State Golf tournament, and\$75 for three, \$25 gift-cards for the monthly Young Citizen of the Month award. The Club's bank balance at the end of April was \$7,100.24, and with the receivables from the foundation and outstanding meals, the Club has a Potential Cash Position of \$13,171.60.

Committee Reports



Band Committee members Tom Casteel, Clyde Nevins, Al Renz, Bill Clarke and Alfred Adams reported on the band concerts they had attended recently. Each one had glowing reports about the skills of the students as displayed in the pieces performed at the concerts. Also, they reported on the gratitude expressed to them from some of

the parents, teachers and students for allowing needy students to take part in band programs.



Eureka Battie reported that she is still pursuing getting **JOI Clubs** at three schools. Still in work are:

- Columbia High School still needs 8 more students to sign up for starting a JOI Club. They will work through the summer months to recruit new members so a JOI club can begin in August.
- *Jemison High School's* JOI Club had a setback when the advisor moved from the school. Eureka Battie has not given up on having a JOI Club at the school next fall.
- Chapman Middle School now has a volunteer teacher to sponsor a JOI Club there. Al Adams and Eureka Battie will work with the teacher to get a running start next August.

New Business

Tom Casteel presented a proposed **revision to the Club's Policy and Procedure Manual**. The revision had been reviewed and approved by the Club's Board of Directors early this month. The new policy would pass on the reduction in OI membership dues (\$40 per year) for the occasional special incentive programs by OI.

Motion: Jim Berry moved that the proposed revision be approved. Alfred Adams seconded the motion. The motion was passed by voice vote.

Tom Casteel said he would soon be issuing a new revision of the entire Policy and Procedures Manual to all Club members.

Gay Pepper reminded the Club that it has been our policy to honor Optimists who have deceased with a **memorial gift** in the amount of \$100 for each year they served in the Club. Dr. Sidney Sandridge had been a loyal member for 15 years. In discussion, it was reported that Dr. Sandridge's family had requested donations to the Fords Chapel United Methodist Church Benevolent Fund in lieu of flowers.

Motion: Tom Casteel moved that the Club request the Optimist Foundation to donate \$1,500 to the Fords Chapel United Methodist Church Benevolent Fund in memory of Dr. Sidney Sandridge. Gay Pepper seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Huntsville Optimist Foundation Report



Foundation President Alberto Duarte reported on the assets of the Foundation as of May 17, 2017. Assets managed by Regions are now valued at \$888,708.00. Assets managed by Synovus are valued at \$156388.37. The total Foundation assets are now \$1,045,096.37. This is an increase over last month

despite a significant drop in the market on May 17.
