Program



President Vastell welcomed **Fabiani Duarte** as our speaker for tonight, saying he was one of our own and needed no introduction. Fabiani had returned to Huntsville just yesterday after finishing his Master of Theology degree at Mercer

Seminary in Atlanta, GA.

Fabiani opened his talk by recounting the several difficulties he had had in getting a U-Haul to move his "stuff" back to Huntsville, including two flat tires that gummed up the process.

He then gave a brief overview of his immediate future: As of yesterday, he signed his oath of office, and is now a 1st Lieutenant in the United States Air Force—without one day of training, he reminded us. He is to report to Maxwell AFB in Montgomery, AL, on June 26 for basic training. [I asked him if that means marching, shooting, learning the manual of arms, going over obstacle courses, etc., and he wasn't sure about all of those]

He said he needs to buy some good shoes and get a GI haircut before reporting—and he is only allowed to bring \$60 for his food.

After completing basic training (assuming he survives), he is to report to Holloman AFB in Alamogordo, NM, where he is scheduled for two years of duty with the Judge Advocate General Corps. He anticipates an active schedule in trying cases for the JAGs there (he said it must be a high-crime area). He is looking forward to experiencing the culture of New Mexico, especially the various Native American Pueblos. He explained that lawyers are often called "ministers of justice," so his theology degree will help him be a good minister.

Fabiani then recounted the steps that have led him to this place in his life. He tied in how all of his life experiences, beginning with participating in the Club's Oratorical Contest and ending with his latest Theology degree. These were the main points that he wanted to leave with us:

- Look for the "story within the story" in many situations. The most obvious is not necessarily the most important thing to find.
- Becoming the "best version of yourself" is a very important lesson.
- God's will for your life doesn't mean that you are to be a passive recipient, but His presence allows you to seek your role in life.

In closing, Fabiani said "Thank you" to the Club for being such a big part of his life experiences. He said, "I didn't just drop from the sky as a 1st Lieutenant--I stand on your shoulders."

Closing

Vastell offered our speaker a tile with the Optimist Creed, but he declined, saying he had plenty of them. Fabiani drew for our attendance prize and Jesse Lang won (again!). I told Fabiani to put Jesse's name at the bottom.

Vastell led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.
