Treasurer's Report



Treasurer Al Renz distributed his financial report for the Club's fiscal year ending September 30, 2017. Highlights from his report were:

The revenue for the year was \$746.47 over the budgeted amount. Most of this was the result of George McDonough's leadership in increasing revenue from last year's Pecan Sale.
Expenses for the year were \$3,419.79 below budget. Much of this was due to having fewer members' meals paid through the Club's books. The budgeted amount for District Meeting travel expenses was also less due to President Vastell not being able to attend all the meetings.

- Expenditures for Youth Activities and Community Service were \$1,182.37 below budget, mostly due to not hosting the Youth Appreciation Banquet.

The Club's bank balance at the end of our fiscal year was \$14,221, which compares to \$10,476 at the beginning of the year.

Al also reported that the Club did not receive the \$150 due from Jeff Klimek in October. The matter has been turned over to our attorney who has brought results when this happened earlier.

Committee Reports



Clyde Nevins reported for Alberto Duarte on current **JOI Club Committee** activities. Alberto has received a lot of interest in reestablishing a JOI Club at Whitesburg School. Alberto will be meeting with the Assistant Principal and three teachers on Tuesday, October 24, at 4:00 p. m. He would like as many "warm bodies" there as possible

to show the school our interest.

Old Business



Bill Clarke spoke up about the poor quality of the meal we had at the Huntsville Country Club for our evening meeting this month. He said food was canned and tasteless, and the turkey, if that's what it was, tasted like ham. Other members concurred. Bill said he would much prefer to go back to the Blue Plate Café where the food

was cheaper, tasted better, and offered options. President Eureka said she had received several similar complaints and will be addressing the problem with the Huntsville Country Club.



The **Youth Appreciation Banquet**, which had been postponed from September to November, **has now been cancelled**. One of the main problems was obtaining contact information of the CAFY award winners from the City for the event. President Eureka said that she thinks there would be no problem getting the information directly from the parents during the presentation at the monthly City Council meeting where the

award is presented.

New Business

President Eureka asked the Club their preference on whether to participate in



the **Veterans' Day Parade** on Saturday, Nov. 11. Kathy Anderson, who usually chairs this project will be out of the Country. Consequently both she and her convertible will not be available. It was also reported that the pole which supports the Optimist banner that leads our entry needs repair. After some discussion, Bob

Hirschbuehler, Danielle Hartung and Eureka Battie volunteered to be in the parade, providing a suitable convertible can be found to ride in.



Gay Pepper, who chairs our annual **Christmas Party**, said she recommends holding the party at the Huntsville Country Club, replacing our evening meeting there on December 7th. Huntsville Optimist Foundation Report



Foundation President Alberto Duarte reported in absentia on the assets of the Foundation as of October 19, 2017. Assets managed by Regions are now valued at \$914,091. Assets managed by Synovus are valued at \$165,379. This sum of these, \$1,079,379, is more than \$16,000 greater than reported at the

September business meeting.

Zone Update



President Eureka reported she has attended a Club meeting of all the Optimist Clubs in our Zone since becoming President. She said the Huntsville clubs, in particular, take their cue from our Club, to the extent that they often initiate projects that mirror our projects and compete with them.
