Treasurer's Report



Treasurer Al Renz distributed his financial report for the Club's initial month (October) in this fiscal year:

- The revenue for the month was \$4,090.00, mostly from the Pecan Fund Raiser membership dues and meal charges.
- Expenses for the month were \$4,029.09, most of which was paying for the pecans for the fund raiser. Other large expenses were for members' meals and OI dues.
- Expenditures for Youth Activities and Community Service were \$1,721.06, which came mostly from the Band Instrument program plus a little over \$200 for JOI club installations.
- The Club's bank balance at the end of October was \$11,486.50. When all meals are paid for and pecan sale money paid, the Club has a potential cash position of \$14,938.06.

Al also reported that the Club did not receive the \$150 due from Jeff Klimek in October. This made 3 months in a row that Mr. Klimek was delinquent in his payment. The matter has been turned over to our attorney who has brought results when this happened earlier.

Committee Reports



Pecan Sale Chairman Alfred Adams reported that all the pecans except one batch of 10 have been picked up, but 7 members have not yet paid for their allotment (money was due today!). Even with the delinquent payments, the fund raiser is \$300 to the good with the money received so far. Member Byrom Goodwin, in addition to selling his allotment of 10

bags also sent a check for \$100 in memory of deceased members Joe Pullen and Zack Thompson.



President Eureka reported that **Chapman Middle School** has asked our Club to come to the school on Friday, Nov. 17 at 9:00 a. m. to present the JOI Clubs to the 6th, 7th and 8th grades at a "simultaneous symposium" at the school. President Eureka will attend with some other Club members to present the JOI Club program. We hope to get one or more JOI Clubs from Chapman from this activity.



Grace Lutheran High School's JOI Club is sponsoring a semiformal dance, "An Evening in Candy Land," on Friday, December 8 at the school. The dance is open to all 9th through 12th grade students in North Alabama. Admission is \$5, and proceeds from

the event will go to support "Friends of Rescue," a non-profit rescuing dogs and cats.



Alberto Duarte announced that **Whitesburg Middle School** will be installing their JOI Club officers on Friday, November 17, at 4 p. m. at the school. Our Club will install the officers and supply pizza for attendees.



Tom Casteel reported that while only 4 members (plus Eureka's twin sons) turned out to be in our entry in the **Veterans' Day Parade**, the Club got valuable exposure nonetheless. Each entry got an announcement over the PA system as they passed the Veterans Memorial, and this included where to get membership information. Our

entry was composed of Danielle Hartung's Jeep preceded by the new Club banner that Tom Casteel had made. See photo at the end of the newsletter.



Pancake Breakfast Chairman Alberto Duarte confirmed the February 3, 2018 date for the Club's annual project to support the Hawthorne Conservatory. He said Al Renz is already printing the tickets. More information to come later.



Gay Pepper, chairperson of our annual **Christmas Party**, circulated a sign-up sheet for our annual party at the Huntsville Country Club on December 7th.
