Program



This month's program chairman Tom Casteel introduced our speaker for the evening, **Ms. Sharon Langford of the Huntsville Fire Department**. Ms. Langford is one of the seven Assistant Fire Marshals in the department.

Ms. Langford gave an interesting and informative talk on how to prevent fires in one's home. She began by giving the common sources of fires:

kitchen grease fires and electrical fires.



Grease fires are best snuffed out by simply putting a lid on the flame in the pan. If that doesn't do the job, use a fire extinguisher and accept the clean-up mess to follow. First, of course, is knowing where your fire extinguisher is and that it is in good working order. Then, to extinguish the fire, remember the acronym PASS:

Pull the pin on the fire extinguisher

Aim the extinguisher nozzle at the base of the fire

 \mathbf{S} queeze the handle of the extinguisher

Sweep the nozzle back and forth.

If your fire extinguisher is old, it may need recharging (there are several companies in Huntsville that do that) or replacement (if it was made before 1989). Ms. Langford strongly recommends getting an ABC rated fire extinguisher that is effective in all sorts of fires.



Another common source of fires is the improper use of extension cords. A single extension cord is meant to be a temporary way to get power to a device. If the cord is used as a permanent solution or is piggy backed onto yet another extension cord or power strip, or if it's covered with a rug or mat, you are asking for trouble.

Daylight Saving Time is a traditional time to check and/or replace the battery on your smoke detector and is this coming Sunday. A properly placed smoke detector with a good battery can save your life.

Closing

President Eureka gave our speaker a tile with the Optimist Creed and asked her to draw a name for our attendance prize. Byrom Goodwin's name was drawn first, and he missed out for the umpteenth time. Jim Roe was the next name drawn, and Jim shared his winnings with the Club's childhood cancer fund.
