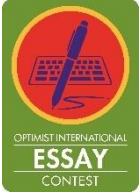


JOI Clubs- Edmonton Heights is building a JOI Club, the club will be up and running soon. It will be a community JOI club. Joseph Lee will be the advisor.

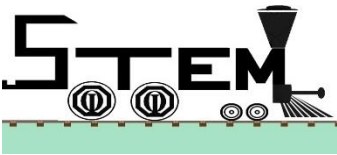

Foundation President Alberto Duarte gave a report on the Foundation's investments as of the close of the market's close on December 2018. The Foundations account at Regions is now worth \$837,300 and the account at Synovus is worth \$165,635. Bringing the total out to be, \$1,002,935.
