Jim Berry, one of our own, was speaker today. Jim is a Methodist minister, having a degree from Birmingham Southern College in 1953. He's moved around a lot during his career, as Methodists do, arriving in Huntsville in 1966. Soon after that he joined the Huntsville Optimist Club, and was an active member for some time. Sidney invited him to rejoin us a few years ago. Today Jim traced his involvement, and indeed leadership, that has grown into our current popular senior

center, important to many of us. In addition to being a center for recreation and training, e.g., computer courses, "Meals-on-Wheels" is managed out of the senior center. Jim's story started during Albert Brewer's administration, where the Governor supported seeking federal grants for funds that had become available as a result of Great Society and Civil Rights legislation. The Huntsville program became a model for the state. Early on, Jim helped organize commodity distribution of surplus food to the poor and elderly. He gave credit to several individuals who became active in this work, and the evolvement of a senior center from meager beginnings at various locations to the rather acceptable quarters at Big Spring Park where the Huntsville Museum of Art is now situated, to the current fine facilities out near Brahan Spring, across the street from our future special needs playground. Thanks, Jim, for your dedicated service to our community. As Grantland Rice one penned: "When the One Great Score comes to mark against your name, He writes – not that you won or lost – but how you played the game." Duane Plank won the attendance prize.
