Then Bob continued our program with a description of his many faceted experiences working for Boeing in Seattle, mostly in management and sales. He remarked that one of things he enjoys about Seattle is that it is not polarized, and is a great place to live. He offered that partisan politics is secondary to solving problems, and that the whole country could benefit from such an outlook and just move forward. It was evident that both sons were proud of their dad and his achievements – as are we.
