

Tom Casteel introduced today's speaker, space scientist and science fiction novelist Stephanie Osborn. Stephanie holds math and science credentials from Vanderbilt and other prestigious schools. She has 20 years experience in engineering and science, but currently devotes her time to writing.

An event occurred (The Shuttle Columbia Disaster) that had a major impact on her career. She had in hand for about a year her first draft of her first novel, and she read part

of it to us. It was uncanny how her writing described in detail what happened. She thought about not continuing with the book project, but instead decided to pursue writing full- time.

She found it not easy breaking in as a new author, and went on to relate a very discouraging picture to anyone thinking of becoming a writer. First, she needed an agent, but this turned out to be very difficult since agents wanted to read what she had published. Overcoming this problem was a struggle, but she finally connected up with a sympathetic agent who put her in touch with an editor who discredited her work.

The agent, however, was able to help her find a less critical editor. She proceeded to distribute an e-book for comments, leading to galley proofs and an unbounded manuscript to be checked for accuracy. Finally, she published her first novel. It was well received and she now has several follow-on works which she had with her.

Jim Roe commented that he had read her first novel and highly recommends it, especially to those having NASA affiliations.
