They have the need for a lot of practical experience to supplement their formal studies, especially as regards the older patient. American medical schools require no training in geriatric medicine. Pneumonia, in a 50-year old, may cause fever, coughing and breathing difficulty; whereas, an 80-year old may often experience confusion and

unsteadiness. In either case the patient usually ends up in the hospital and is given an antibiotic. Often the dose is too great for the 80-year old, leading to kidney failure and other confusion, e.g., pulling the IV tube from the arm or the catheter from bladder. The nurse is usually directed to tie the patient's arms to the bed to prevent self harm. This inactivity can cause loss of muscle and bone mass. Eventually the patient recovers from pneumonia and is discharged, but is likely more frail than the person prior to the illness.

Even though most medical students may never treat a child or deliver a baby training in pediatrics and obstetrics is required. More than \$8 billion per year (about 50% of medical costs) supports older patient care. A recent article in American Medicine recommends that every medical student prior to graduation should demonstrate effective care for elderly by passing a resolution, nicknamed "Don't Kill Granny," but it must have teeth. Jim added a personal note that he and Jesse Lang recently talked with Dr. Khan, heart specialist, and Jesse's medication was significantly reduced.

Following this interlude by Jim, Zack summarized the status of magnetic levitated trains in our country. He concluded that Japan and China are well ahead of us for many reasons – mostly political.
