Madison Jazz gave them a good taste, starting with sounds from the 1920s and going through the big band favorites and beyond. There were 35 musicians in the group, from ages 14 to 23, and Barbara described some exciting experiences.

She was especially impressed by the growing Chinese economy. Major cities have 3 and 4 times the population of NYC, and she showed pictures of cranes at work across the horizon building high-rise apartments and offices 24/7. Evidence of old China and new rich China were everywhere. Manufacturing is going at breakneck speed with 80% of products being exported.

Wages are low by our standards while pollution is high due to inexpensive coal-fired factories, but she is concerned that their dedicated hard work and determination for excellence will overcome their shortcomings, and that their strong economic growth should be a concern for today's world leading countries. Hopefully, a taste of the good life, as we know it, will slow down this locomotive.
