He joined our club several months ago. George said only someone dealing with caring for a loved one in need of care over a long period of time could understand what he has experienced.

He discussed the high level of professionalism offered by Hospital Emergency Rooms through their dedicated staff and state-of-the-art equipment, but he also noted how expensive this was. In some cases the Center for Aging, founded by Dr. Khan, is an alternative to the ER. As George put it "Nothing is as strong as an idea whose time has come."

George sees skyrocketing health care costs as one of the major concerns of our country. At Center for Aging a patient can simply walk in and be treated to a primary evaluation, and be referred to a specialist familiar with and sympathetic to problems unique to the elderly.

Jesse Lang gave a testimony of how he had been helped by the Center for Aging, and the part Jim Berry played in arranging for an appointment with Dr. Khan – cost free.
