Program

This month's program chairman, Jim Berry, called on George McDonough to introduce our speaker, Diana Hankey Underwood, Director & Motivational/Educational Speaker at Grace Anatomy. George, as Chairman of the Center for Aging, introduced the topic of today's program, incontinence, especially regarding this problem in older men. Statistics show that a the large number of people, both men and women, suffer either urinary or fecal incontinence, and the Center for Aging sought and found who they consider the best person to lead their program in this area. Ms. Underwood is licensed to treat incontinence in females, but has a wealth of experience regarding treatment in men as well.

Ms. Underwood showed a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Plumbing, Shame, and a Better Way of Life." The presentation began with statistics showing the large number of people who suffer from either occasional or daily incontinence, and the need to provide information that will help them live better lives. She handed out a booklet entitled *The Pit Stop* that provides information for determining the cause(s) of incontinence.

The next segment of the program was devoted to products that are available for contending with problems deriving from incontinence. She related how skin problems as the result of incontinence can be serious, even fatal. There are OTC skin barrier creams such as Boudreaux's Butt Paste and Rash Mist in the baby care section of a pharmacy which are excellent for preventing skin problems. She also showed several of a table-full of products she had brought designed to allow freedom of travel without concern or embarrassment for those with an incontinence problem.

In conclusion, Ms. Underwood stressed that ignoring the problem is costly, serious, painful and expensive. There are drug treatments, surgical treatments and coping techniques that are available for anyone who will take the step to get help.
