Program

Jack Fauble introduced the program speaker for the meeting, Mr. Curtis Hunt, Director of the Madison County Boy Scout Council. Mr. Hunt briefly reviewed the history, programs and mission of the Boy Scouts of America, and listed the highlights of the Madison County Council in 2011. Among the notable highlights were:

- 600 new youth were recruited for the Scouting Program
- Over 400 boys attended summer camps
- 77 Eagle Scout Awards were earned. This is 18% of the total for the Alabama council.
- 11 tons of food was raised for the Salvation Army
- 11,000 hours were given to community service

In response to a question, Mr. Hunt said there is a need for adult (over 18) volunteers at the summer Day Camp, and also for membership in the District Committee.

Tom Casteel asked for two volunteers needed to fill in and give awards at the upcoming middle school band concerts. Two schools were not covered due to conflicts or illness. Gay Pepper and Fabiani Duarte stepped up to the task. Al Renz distributed the checks for \$100 to each Band Committee member for them to award at the concerts this month.
