#### **New Business**

Tom reported on a very productive meeting, lasting nearly 2 hours, with Huntsville's Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Casey Wardynski, and newly hired Director of Operations, Dr. Jeffery Wilson. Attending for the Optimist Club of Huntsville were Al Renz, Milt Williams, and Tom Casteel. Also attending the meeting were representatives of Still Serving Veterans, including Fabiani Duarte. The meeting was called to discuss the benefits and participation of these two organizations working in our City schools.

The meeting resulted in two primary conclusions: (1) A more structured curriculum is needed for defining the community service projects to be done by JOOI Clubs. One good possibility is to choose from monthly projects outlined by GenerationOn (see their web site: www.http://learningtogive.org/), and (2) There is a need for the city to provide a stipend for teachers who take on the added responsibility of being a JOOI Club Sponsor. The suggested stipend was \$2,500 per year, and Dr. Wardynski asked his Director of Operations to see if his budget could accommodate this expenditure.

# **Committee Reports**

Tom reported on the Band Committee. All of our 125 instruments have now been through the cleaning and necessary repairs at an expense of about \$7,000. Tom has been negotiating with Robbins Music on how we can reduce this large expenditure, and a tentative agreement has been reached. For a flat fee of \$4 per month per instrument, Robbins will clean and repair (as many times as are needed) all of the Club's musical instruments throughout the year. This is well below the cost they normally charge, \$6.40 per month per instrument, since Mr. Robbins likes what we are doing. This new agreement would start in October.

No other committee reports were forthcoming. New criteria on the Essay and Oratorical Contests should be available at the District Meeting in August.

Tom announced he will begin contacting members for next year's committee assignments soon.

#### **Schedule Reminders**

Duane Plank urged a good turnout next week to hear Dr. Copeland's talk on the status of Madison County Schools.

The District Meeting is August 9-12 at Tuskegee. Motel information for the meeting is on the AL-MS-La website. If you plan to attend, let Tom know. He is leaving early to teach some training seminars.

Fabiani Duarte is Program Chairman for August. Dr. Wardynski and Dr. Wilson are tentatively scheduled for one of the August meetings.

There will be no meeting on August 30, the fifth Thursday in August.
