Dr. Hobbs related about how he had a vision over a year ago to start a program designed to encourage youth of our community to pursue higher education and become good citizens. With support of city leaders, the first C.A.F.Y. event was held last August for city youth, and over 1,000 attended. This year, the program has expanded to include youth in all

The event is designed to attract attendance of our youth by incorporating live music, dance groups, fast food, attendance prizes, and a variety of interactive demonstrations—all free. Free book bags filled with school supplies will be given to the first 500 youth who attend. The event is targeted for youth from 7th grade through 12th grade, but youth of all ages are welcome.

Mrs. Hobbs stated that there will be 90 organizations represented at the event, with 70 indoor and 20 outdoor booths. Booths will be sponsored by law enforcement groups, youth organizations, civic organizations, HEMSI, NASA, Army, and the Space and Rocket Center. Many will provide opportunities for networking with the youth afterwards.

Dr. & Mrs. Hobbs invited Optimists to attend the event, and any donations to help with the expenses of the event would be welcome. The Mayor has designated the event to be held annually on the third Saturday in August. This year's C.A.F.Y. event will be:

August 18, 10:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the Jaycees Building, 2180 Airport Road.

Optimists are encouraged to attend. It looks like something we would want to be a part of in future years to promote our JOOI Clubs and Optimism in general.

Closing

Dr. Hobbs did not draw George McDonough's name, but he pretended to in order to comply with a set-up by Jim Berry designed to embarrass George. The real winner of today's attendance prize was Jim Roe. Carl Winkler led the recitation of the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.
