Program



This month's program chairman, Fabiani Duarte introduced today's speaker Fran Fluhler, Director of Manna House. Ms. Fluhler stated the Manna House is a 501©3

corporation that takes no money from the Government. All funds are provided by 17 local churches and individuals. The basic goal of Manna House is for no family to go hungry, but it provides many more services to people who are going through tough times and are not eligible for Government welfare programs.

Besides providing nutritious food items three times a week, Manna House distributes fresh, organically grown produce one a week, hygiene items (diapers, wipes, etc.), pet food, school supplies, and weekend food packs for school children.

People who are going hungry form a line at Manna House starting around noon, and the food items are distributed as soon as possible (often much earlier than the nominal 4 p. m. start) thereafter, often lasting to past 8 p. m. People in line are also offered PB&J sandwiches to tide them over. The Personal Emergency Resources for Kids in School (P.E.R.K.S.) program is now providing over 800 backpacks filled with canned meat, crackers, granola bars, juicy juice, etc., to children in elementary and middle school children who otherwise would go hungry on Saturday and Sunday.

The One Harvest Monthly Distribution program provides a large box of frozen food for pick-up at local churches. Clients of this program pre-order these boxes and pay for them at a greatly reduced cost. Ms. Fluhler stated that volunteers are welcome at Manna House! She invited *anyone* to come to see what some in our city are doing for the needy of our city. There is no need to call or sign up—just show up. Anyone older than 4 years of age can be put to work, and it promises to be a rewarding experience. Manna House is located just north of the ROCK Family Worship Center, 2300 So. Memorial Parkway SW.

Closing

Buddy Beck won the attendance prize on the first drawing. Carl Winkler closed the meeting by leading the recitation of the Optimist Creed.
