our speaker for today, Mrs. Cathy Miller. Mrs. Miller is the parttime Education Coordinator for the United Way of Madison County. Mrs. Miller presented a PowerPoint presentation on the various programs supported by our local United Way. She stated that in 2011, over \$7,000,000 was provided by United Way (including disaster relief), and over 34,000 individuals were helped. There are three initiatives of the United Way: Education, Income, and Health. All three areas are needed to have a decent quality of life. Some highlights given for each initiative:

Fabiani Duarte introduced

Education:

One emphasis is readiness to achieve in school, including the "Wonder Walk" program at the Huntsville/Madison County Public Library. This program familiarizes pre-kindergarten kids with numbers, letters, & colors. Other programs stress academic achievement and reducing the drop-out rate. The Unite Way is currently involved in a community book drive, and they hope to acquire over 8,000 books. [Several Optimists brought books to the meeting to support this effort]

Income:

The United Way programs funded are geared to increasing the financial stability of lower income families. In 2011, 75% of the families serviced by United Way were classified as living in poverty. Programs promote informing families of help that is available, including affordable day care and free income tax preparation, and promoting financial literacy.

<u>Health</u>

United Way supports CASA for senior citizens and HEALS clinics for children. They provide the 211 hot line for social services information, including child abuse. There is also a free prescription drug program for families that qualify. These cards are good at about 85 % of local pharmacies.

Upon the closure of the Volunteer Office, United Way became the clearing house for volunteers in the community. Opportunities for volunteering are given on their web site, www.uwhsv.org.

In summary, Mrs. Miller said anyone can become a partner in three different ways: COLLABORATE, VOLUNTEER, DONATE. "The key is to act: how can we together change this community one life at a time? She said the local United Way office is very efficient, and is now running about 20% below the national average on administrative expenses.

Closing
