Fabiani Duarte thanked all those who have recently participated in giving out the JOOI Club awards, especially the tokens of appreciation to the faculty sponsors at the schools. He also gave a brief report on the activities of our JOOI Club at Morris Elementary School.

Al Renz reported that the OI lists 55 JOOI Clubs established worldwide this past year, and our Club established nine of them.

#### **Program**



This month's Program Chairman, Al Renz introduced Achievement our speaker for the day, Leah Amos. Leah is the current

President of the Junior Achievement of North Alabama. She oversees the JA activities of over 8,000 youth in North Alabama plus Lincoln County, TN. Al related how he had bought a product of a Junior Achievement Club over 50 years ago—a kitchen cutting board in the shape of a pig-which inspired him to seek the local JA leader to be our speaker.

Leah gave out either a "NEED" or "WANT" card to each person, and said she would give a quiz she typically gives to first graders. She showed flash cards of various items, asking us to hold up the appropriate card at the count of three.

The flash cards showed: Clothing, Video Games, a Puppy, a House, and a High School Diploma. Many Club members failed the "Are You Smarter than a First Grader" test by not waiting for the count of three before holding up their cards.

Leah described the various programs now being undertaken by JA, reaching children from kindergarten through 12th grade. In contrast to its original programs, with its after-school business enterprises where items were actually made and sold, JA is now primarily going into school classrooms to teach Work Place Readiness, Entrepreneurism, and Finance Basics. JA also recently started a program at the Detention Center with a goal to help detainees learn skills that will keep them from repeating their mistakes.

JA sponsors several activities to acquaint children with what actually goes on in the work place. They provide a one-day Job Shadow where children spend a day observing the "real world" in a particular career field. They also have Summer Internships at Boeing for 14 high-school students. In the summer, JA holds a one-week Entrepreneurship Camp at UAH. In September, JA sponsors a one-day "Adventures in Engineering" tour of various Redstone Arsenal locations.

JA gets its funding mostly from major corporation donations and its annual Bowl-a-thon and Golf tournament. A few private individuals also donate.

Leah said volunteers are always needed. Volunteers will get to actually teach kids in the classroom using professionally produced materials. Interested individuals may contact her through the JA website, <a href="www.janaonline.org">www.janaonline.org</a>.
