# Program, Part 1



President George called on Al Renz to introduce the advisor of our JOOI Club at Columbia High School, Ms. Kristen Lecroix. Ms. Lecroix reported on the activities of the club there which center around providing opportunities for club members to volunteer for community service in Huntsville. She said their club has 14 active members who average 21

hours per person per month working with organizations such as:

- Saving Way Thrift Store
- Merrimac Hall
- Manna House
- Agape
- Botanical Gardens
- Burritt on the Mountain
- Lowe Mill
- Miracle League

Ms. Lecroix said she would be happy to provide assistance to other JOOI Clubs who might be having trouble getting started with community service projects. She has a list of contacts for the above organizations plus experience in how to get started with them.

# Program, Part 2



Al Renz rose to introduce Ms. Pam Clasgens, the new activities director at HEALS, Inc. To begin, Al related how our Club's Community Service Committee had found HEALS,

Inc., to submit the most professional grant proposals through the years, and had consistently been awarded the highest dollar amount from our Community Service Awards allocations. Our own Matt Hancock is a member of the HEALS board of directors.

Ms. Clasgens began her talk by thanking the Club for all they do for kids. She said her daughter, now at Grissom HS, was president of the JOOI Club at Whitesburg MS last year, and she had had the pleasure of attending last year's Youth Appreciation Banquet.

Ms. Clasgens said HEALS, Inc. is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization in Huntsville, Alabama, dedicated to providing accessible quality, school-based primary health care for children through collaborative efforts with the Huntsville City/Madison County school systems and the medical community. It is a "homegrown" organization and not part of any national organization. They treat needy children from infancy through 18 years of age, and treat about 2000 kids per year. Their funding comes sources consist of:

- 50% from grants applied for
- 25% from Medicaid reimbursements
- 25% from donations (such as those from our Club)

She stated that 91% of every dollar received goes directly to patient care.

Today, HEALS has medical clinics at Martin Luther King Elementary School, Morris Elementary School, and University Place Elementary School in Huntsville, and at Madison Cross Roads Elementary School in Madison County. In addition, HEALS has a dental clinic at Martin Luther King Elementary School. There are several doctors and dentists who volunteer their time to work at these clinics. Their clinics provide everything that regular doctor's or dentist's offices provide. She said that they had found a great need for dental care; many children had never seen a dentist.

She told one anecdote about a child who received a toothbrush after his dental exam, whereupon the child asked, "Is this just for me or for my whole family?" (The child was given enough toothbrushes for the entire family.)

Ms. Clasgens related on some new initiatives by HEALS. (1)They are adding a dental clinic at Madison Cross Roads Elementary School; (2) They will add medical clinics at the Harris Home for Children and Lincoln Academy. (3)HEALS also has begun a "Heels for HEALS" program whereby they provide about 1000 pair of new athletic shoes per year to kids who cannot afford them.

In response to a question, Ms. Clasgens said they would welcome donations of new athletic shoes, tooth brushes, tooth paste and dental floss. These items may be dropped off at their office at 1100 Meridian St. in Huntsville.

# Closing

President George McDonough thanked our speaker, presented her a coaster with our Optimist Creed, and asked her to draw the name for our attendance prize. The first name drawn was Alberto Duarte, and Alberto was present.

Dr. Carl Winkler closed the meeting by leading us in the reciting the Optimist Creed




