Treasurer's Report



President Al asked Treasurer Al Renz for his Treasurer's report. Al's report covered the first four months of this fiscal year—through January 31, 2015. Highlights of Al's report are:

- We continued to receive Jeff Klimek's monthly payment of \$150.
- The Youth Activities expenditures continue to be the only expenditures for the year to date, totaling \$5,173.05.
- Outstanding dues at the end of January totaled \$1,834.00.
- Our bank balance at the end of January was **\$3,901.35**.

Pancake Breakfast Financial Report

Treasurer Al Renz also reported on the

results of our fundraising project, the recent Pancake Breakfast:

Income: \$900 from the Club's ticket sales; \$1,010 from the Church's ticket sales; and \$530 taken at the door (which included a \$250 donation).

Expenses: \$458.91

Net Profit: \$1,981.09 (to be presented to the Hawthorne Conservatory)

Committee Reports



Oratorical Contest Committee Chairman, Alberto Duarte, reported that everything is ready for the contest to be held March 7, at 900 a. m., at the Cooper House. He said he expects several contestants from Randolph HS,

but other than that, he is in the dark about other contestants. He urged the Club to contact anyone who has children in the required age bracket to encourage entering.



Al Adams reminded all JOOI Club contacts that we need some volunteers to man our booth at the **Kite Contest**, also to be held on **March 7 beginning at 11:00 a. m**. He also asked JOOI Club contacts to borrow the JOOI Club banners for display in our booth at the contest. Tom Casteel has ordered the balsa wood gliders we will give away at the contest.

President Al Adams reported he met with the principal at Chapman MS, and a new advisor has been named for the **Chapman MS JOOI Club. Johnson High School** is still dragging their feet on getting started.

There was a discussion on how to rejuvenate our defunct JOOI Clubs. John Inman said the key to a successful club was getting an enthusiastic teacher to be the club sponsor. Al Adams said he is familiar with teachers' work loads, and "teachers think they are a lot busier than they are."



Alberto Duarte, president of the **Optimist Foundation** reported that the Foundation's investments lost about \$22,000 during January due to the rather sharp marked downturn. He expects our account in February will regain most, if not all, of that loss.

New Business



President Al Adams reported that **Mullins Restaurant closed this week**, unannounced to our Club or to the employees. Al said he tried unsuccessfully to retrieve our badges and banners which are stored in the restaurant. Since this has been our regular meeting place, we have to scramble for a place to meet next week as well as look for another regular eating place (being

investigated by Gay Pepper and her committee). (NOTE: Since the meeting Al was able to retrieve our banners and PA system through the property owner)

Our caterer for the day, Kathy Belcher said she might be able to accommodate the Club on Thursdays in her restaurant, **The Cozy Bean Café**, on Whitesburg Dr., but we would have to share half of the café with other patrons, perhaps separated by a screen.

She suggested we could also look at **Wenzel's Oyster House** and the **Huntsville Country Club** (which recently reopened for business).

Alberto Duarte said he had approached the **Cooper House** and they would charge the Club \$80 room fee, but would give us *one* free use. He also has contacted **Rosie's** on South Parkway, and they would also give us *one* free use of their meeting room.



Gay Pepper's committee was scheduled to have tried out the **88 Buffet** on Feb. 10, but no one on her committee was at today's meeting to report on their findings. Buddy Beck had previously

contacted them, and they do have a separate room for us to meet with no room charge.

Motion: Richie Myers moved that the Club meet at the **88 Buffet** one time next Thursday. Buddy Beck seconded.

After some discussion of the other possibilities listed above, the motion carried.

The meeting time will be 11:30 (instead of 11:45) due to influx of cars in the nearby parking lot around noon. See map at the end of the newsletter. This is a trial, and not intended to be a permanent location at this time.


