

# **Treasurer's Report**



Treasurer Al Renz distributed the financial report for October, the first month of our fiscal year. For the month, our revenues exceeded our expenses by \$159.69. We now have 41 members.

Youth Activities Expenditures were \$2,611.30 for the Band Instrument program, and \$72.79 for JOOI Club expenses. We currently have reimbursement requests to the Foundation of \$5,464.09.

The Bank Balance at the end of October was \$2,680.71. Once the reimbursement is received from the Foundation, the Club will have a Cash Position of \$8,283.45

# **Committee Reports**

Chairperson Gay Pepper reported that she has finalized the date and location



of the Club's **Christmas party**. The affair will be **at the Cooper House** on Tuesday, December 8 at 6:00 p.m.

She needs to know the number of members and guests who plan to attend, and passed around a sign-up sheet. If you weren't at the

meeting and plan to attend, please call or e-mail Gay.

Gay also announced we will do our traditional **Dirty Santa** gift exchange. All those who care to participate must bring a wrapped gift costing no more than \$10. Gay suggested you bring something you'd be willing to take home yourself.



Al Renz reported that as of today, **only three JOOI Clubs**, Columbia High School, Williams Middle School and Randolph High School, have turned in their paperwork. Grace Lutheran's JOOI Club is up and running (Alberto has installed their officers), but are delinquent in turning in their lists of members and officers to Al.



Foundation President Alberto Duarte reported that the **Foundation's assets** as of yesterday were \$857,738 with Regions Bank, plus a CD with First Commercial. He stated the market has been on the upswing our assets are a good bit better than a couple of months ago.



Al Adams, interim chairman of the **Pecan Sale**, announced that all but 4 bags of pecans were in the hands of Club members to sell. Several members owe the Club for pecans already received, and Al asked that they be paid for by the first meeting in December.

# **New Business**



President Al stated that he had a goal of the Club being involved in five new Youth Activity projects during his term. He reported that was advised by the Huntsville Superintendent of School's office of a need at the Academy of Academics and Arts school. This was sent by e-mail

to all the Club members about three weeks ago. He, Clyde Nevins and Tom Casteel met with Ms. Brenda Levert at the school yesterday to get details of the need.

Ms. Levert said the school's new library has no up-to-date science and technology books. The average copyright date of such books in their library is 1996, making them very much behind the times. The school has created a project to buy about 40 new books for students and teachers that will grow their understanding and assist in the teaching of science and technology. The total cost for the books is \$1,115.86, and all but \$520 has been raised through an account on www.gofundme.com. If the total amount is not raised by January 1, 2016, the gofundme funds will be lost.

Al, Clyde and Tom discussed the various Optimist programs for youth that they would like to see participation in at the school, for which Ms. Levert expressed enthusiasm and a willingness to promote them. Also, she agreed that every book paid for by our Club will contain a sticker advertising the Club's donation.

**Motion:** Jim Berry moved that the Club fund the entire \$520 needed. Clyde Nevins seconded the motion.

# **Discussion:**

There was a good bit of discussion on the motion. Bill Clarke and Alberto Duarte felt this more properly belonged in the Community Service Grants; however, these grants will not be available until months after the January 1 deadline for the gofundme funds.

Treasurer Al Renz noted that there is \$1,350 in our budget for projects such as this, so the \$520 would take a fair-sized chunk of it.

Clyde Nevins said that we have had good cooperation with the Huntsville City School Superintendent's office, and this is a way of showing our support when there is an opportunity to do so. He thought it was a much better use of money than the \$1,000 we sent to the City for the Fishing Rodeo for many years.

Rebecca Billings said we should try to get publicity for the donation—such as a photo and write-up in a local paper. [Since the *Huntsville Times* is hardly a "local paper" anymore, this might be restricted to *Speakin' Out News*, where we have had success in the past]

President Al Adams said he would be following through with the school on their recruiting contestants for our contests and starting a JOOI Club.

## The Vote

President Al called for a vote, and the motion carried by a vote of 12 for and 3 against.
