#### **Community Service Grant**

Executive Director Melvin Allen of the Harvest



**Youth Club** attended our meeting today to receive the Club's Community Service Grant. Melvin passed out brochures which highlight the HYC's various

facilities and programs. He said HYC's primary focus is for kids to get the education they need. In his 30 years' experience, he has learned that with education kids can become just about anything they want to be.

The Harvest Youth Club meets from 3:00 to 6:00 p. m. every afternoon during the school year. Melvin said this is a critical time for many kids because they are out of school but parents are not home from work. Left to their own devices, they often get into trouble rather than do their homework. He was proud to say that 70% of the 300 kids, ages 5-13, at the HYC have made the A/B Honor Roll, and 40% have made the A Honor Roll at their school.

Melvin reported that the Community Storm Shelter on their grounds has been well used during storms since 2011. The Club has a web site, www.harvestyouthclub.com.

In closing, Melvin thanked our Optimist Club for being a friend and a big part of the success of the HYC. President Al Adams presented Melvin the Club's check for \$2,500 to the HYC that from last year's Community Service Grants.

<u>NOTE:</u> The **Application for this year's Community Service Grants is on the Club's web site**. President Al asked Club members to spread the word to any non-profit organization that would care to apply for a grant. Any 501(c)3 corporation is eligible for consideration; however, those serving the youth or the underprivileged are generally awarded our grants.

#### **Program**

Rev. Jim Berry introduced our speaker for today, Dana Bullard. Jim said Dana was his #2 daughter (chronologically). She was speaking today in lieu of her daughter, Kelly, who was unable to get away from her studies at UA in Tuscaloosa during the day.

Kelly was instrumental in getting our JOOI Club established at Hazel Green High School. President Al told how Kelly had worked in his office one summer, and during her time there managed to get things organized. Kelly will be an intern at the National Archives this summer, and if all goes well, plans to extend her stay there. Her long-term goals are to get Masters and Doctors degrees in Library Science. While in Tuscaloosa, besides being a full-time student she is involved in community service, being a tutor/reader in an elementary school there.

Ms. Bullard said she would not give the speech that Kelly had planned because she didn't want to spoil Kelly's opportunity to tell us in person one day. Instead, she told us about her own work. She is a Special Education teacher at the Madison Cross Roads Elementary School. She spends half her school day with the special education students and half with regular students who are struggling.

Ms. Bullard said that the HEALS Clinic that our Club supports is "the best thing ever." Many parents in that area do not drive, nor do many even own a vehicle. Consequently, their children have not received routine medical and dental check-ups. She said the convenience of the HEALS Clinic has been a real blessing for the students. Most come back from their check-ups with big smiles on their faces. The "Shoe Closet" of the HEALS program is also making a big difference in kids' self-esteem.

#### Closing

President Al gave our speakers a tile with the Optimist Creed on it. Ms. Bullard drew for the winner of our attendance prize: Willie Brunetti and Alex Chu both missed out, and President Al Adams won it on the third draw.

Dr. Bill Clarke led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.




