Program

Vastell Williams introduced Ms. Jerilyn Johnson,



Executive Director of New Futures, Inc. Ms. Johnson joined New Futures in 2012 as a volunteer case manager after graduating from

college. Later, she left a paying job to take on the (poorly) paid job of Executive Director at New Futures because "That's where my heart is."

New Futures, Inc., is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that serves families of all compositions that do not qualify for any other shelters in the Madison County area. The basic difference in New Futures is keeping together non-traditional families such as single fathers with children and families with older (from 12 to 18 years) children. The shelter operates in the Marilyn Mabry Family Lodge, with an 8- room dormitory and two suites. The current facility is too small. There is a long waiting list, and some families have been waiting for 8 months.

At this time there are 30 residents at New Futures, and all but one family have a job. The average stay time is 9 months.

The facility has an all-volunteer staff, other than Ms. Johnson. She said they do everything they can to save money, including making their own laundry soap. They get some support from HUD, but only as reimbursement for approved expenses. Manna House provides canned food, and the Downtown Rescue Mission has begun providing evening meals. Residents pay as much rent as they can once they are employed, and they are expected to do chores such as cleaning and minor repairs.

Besides providing basic living accommodations, New Futures provides tutoring for the children at the facility. Ms. Johnson said that homeless children are typically 2 grade levels behind their peers because of constant moving and changing schools. Volunteers from Oakwood and Alabama A & M come to the facility to tutor children every evening, especially in math, and a lady comes once a week to teach science. New Futures recently received a donated van, and Ms. Johnson is planning a summer program of outings to enrich the lives of the children there.

Volunteers are always needed and welcome at New Futures—to teach, to mentor, or to teach a trade to the adults. Eighty percent of the adult residents do not have a high school education. Ms. Johnson would also like to find an organization to provide health care and dental care.

There will be a fundraiser for New Futures at the Asbury United Methodist Church in Madison on Friday evening, April 2. The program features Henry Cho, a comedian (reported to be very funny). Tickets are \$20 and are available at Asbury, any Top Line Tire store, the Mellow Mushroom, and through the New Futures web site: www.keepingfamiliestogethernf.org.

Al Renz encouraged Ms. Johnson to submit a grant request form so the Club could consider giving a grant from our Community Service Awards fund.

Closing

Vice President Vastell gave our speaker a tile with the Optimist Creed on it. Our speaker drew names for the attendance prize:
