# Program



Our speaker for today was **Sarah Savage**, President and CEO of Leadership Huntsville/Madison County. Ms. Savage has been a resident of Huntsville for 24 years, and

has been associated with Leadership for 18 years. She related how she had been in a Junior Optimist in Dothan in her teen years, and also that she had spoken to our Club twice in years past.

Ms. Savage began by giving an overview of the Leadership program in Huntsville. It's one of 55 such programs in Alabama, and one of some 2,000 across the U. S. While generally aimed at young up-and-coming young people, the program also has programs for those retired, or about to be retired who have an interest in getting more engaged in our community. Programs vary in length from two days to 10 months, with tuitions running from \$500 to \$4,500. From 150 to 200 people typically participate in these programs annually in Huntsville.

One interesting demographic brought out by Ms. Savage is that Huntsville is now the second largest metropolitan area in Alabama, having recently outpaced the Mobile area. Furthermore, Huntsville is predicted to be the *largest* metropolitan area in Alabama in just 15 short years. To manage this growth will take knowledgeable and trained leaders, and the time to begin training them for the challenges of this growth is now. That is the mission of Leadership Huntsville/Madison County. For more information on Leadership and their programs check out their web site: www.leadershiphsv.org.

Next, we were shown a short video that featured comments on the Leadership program from many of Huntsville's civic, professional, education and human services leaders. Following the video, Ms. Savage took questions, and we had twenty minutes or so of interesting discussions on such challenges Huntsville has in mental health care, homelessness and the "working poor."

## Closing

Vice President Roe gave our speaker a tile with the Optimist Creed on it. Ms. Savage drew for our minimal attendance prize, which took a while because of our low attendance today. Tom Casteel's name was finally drawn, and he took home barely enough to pay for his gasoline for the trip.

Tom Casteel led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.
