Program



This month's program chairman, George McDonough, introduced our speaker for the evening, **Karen Ammons**. Ms. Ammons is the Community Relations Coordinator for Senior Helpers. Senior Helpers is a business that supplies

caregivers to those families needing assistance in caring for an elderly relative, especially those suffering from Alzheimer's or Parkinson's diseases. The local office is one of 34 in the U. S., and the only one in Alabama.

Ms. Ammons began her talk by telling how she had faced the need of finding caregiver help in her own family. Her father had needed care, which was supplied by her mother. Later on, when her father had died, her mother needed care. She was the eldest child so got the responsibility of hiring full-time care for her mother (who, she said, was a difficult patient). The task vetting a caregiver and finding one that met the approval of her mother was a big responsibility.

Ms. Ammons worked in a hospice agency before moving into her position with Senior Helpers, where she has been for a short time. She described the services of Senior Helpers to be:

- Companion Care (conversation, errands, light housekeeping)
- Personal Care (hygiene assistance, walking assistance)
- Alzheimer's and Dementia Care (monitoring activities and medication)
- Peace of Mind Service (companionship, meal prep, hygiene assistance, etc)

One of the important services of Senior Helpers is supplying licensed, bonded and insured caregivers. Caregivers can be hired for as little as 4 hours per week, or even less in some circumstances. Senior Helpers hires and trains their own staff, including the care needed for the various stages of Alzheimer's and Dementia. She described one interesting phase of the training wherein trainees are given vision-limiting eyeglasses, ear phones, gloves and "prickly things" in their shoes. They are then put in a dimly lit room and verbally given 5 tasks to perform. This gives the trainee an appreciation of what a patient is going through.

Ms. Ammons brought brochures, pens, and "Understanding Alzheimer's and Dementia" guides for giving to our meeting attendees. For more information on Senior Helpers, visit their web site at: seniorhelpers.com/Huntsville.
