Four grant applications have already been received, and committee will meet next week to formulate the evaluation criteria.

McDonough said he has received many, but not all, responses to the personal message he sent to each of the Club members. He said he is not requiring all members to

order 10 bags (as was the case last year). If you haven't told George how many bags you want to order, do it soon. He needs to place the order right away.

Program

The speaker for our program tonight was the Lt. Governor for Optimist Zone 3, Alfred Adams. All brought to the Club his vision of his goals for the zone in the coming year. All began his talk by saying this was the fourth Optimist meeting he had been to this week. It was his third club meeting, including one at Fort Payne, and a Zone meeting which he, himself, had called.

Al distributed a sheet with his goals for the Zone. They are:

- Build a solid working and social relationship among the Zone 3 Clubs.
- Increase participation in the Oratorical and Essay Contests by 25%.
- Earn Distinguished Zone honors.
- Build three new clubs in the Zone.
- Increase membership in each Club by 10 new members.
- Have each Club appoint a Foundation Representative and make an unrestricted donation to the OI Foundation.

He elaborated on these points by saying he wanted the Zone to have more interaction than just the Respect for Law banquet which is about it at this time. We need to get to know each other and work together on more projects. He said that there are three good prospects for starting a new Club: Alabama A & M, Arab, and Guntersville, but he hopes to add two more to the list. He said the District's Club Building Chairman, Tom Casteel, was in our Club, so we have a handy asset for building more clubs.

He especially wants Ft. Payne to feel a part of the Zone. Al said the Ft. Payne Club is very active and is the largest Club in the Zone. They added 15 members last year. With a little help and training in submitting the necessary paperwork to OI, they could easily be an Honor Club.

Alfred made a plea for better attendance at the District Meetings. He noted how one of the Birmingham clubs always has a large number of their members at the District meetings and that they kid him about not having as many members at the meetings. In response to a question on what happens at District meetings, he said it was a combination of social activities and training, with the training sessions tailored to that needed by clubs for the time of the year. Mainly, it is a good chance to interface with other clubs to see what's going on in Optimism in our District.

In closing, Lt. Gov. Al thanked the Club for two good years as president, and he wears his wrist watch and Distinguished Club pin often. He said Zone meetings were open to anyone, and "YOU are invited."

As an added bonus to the program, we heard a few words from the District Club Building Chairman, Tom Casteel. Tom said he has never done this job, but was looking forward to the challenge. He stated that Optimist International had a goal of having

100,000 Optimists by the 100th anniversary of Optimist International in 2019. Since there are only seventy-some thousand members now, it's a big challenge.

Tom is optimistic about founding at least three new clubs. He thinks A & M's club could be operating in the next couple of months. Oakwood College is another potential for club building. Arab once had a club, but the "live wire" in Arab who was to help the restart had left the area. Tom said that invariably the clubs that founded new clubs increased their own membership in the process. One additional incentive, now, is that 4 members may earn the "Builder of Excellence" award instead of the previous 2 members.

Closing

President Vastell didn't give out any Optimist tiles, tonight, but he did ask Tom Casteel to draw a name for our attendance prize. The first name drawn was Al Renz, who hasn't missed a meeting in a long time but did tonight. The next name drawn was Tom Casteel, as luck (?) would have it.

Jim Berry led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.


