Committee Reports



Clyde Nevins reported that the Club's **STEM Committee** has reviewed three of the six grant applications received to date. The first of the scheduled

student presentations was at the Academy for Academics and Arts, and the other two were at Sparkman Middle School. He thanked Jim Roe, George McDonough and Richie Myers for attending and providing their evaluations of the presentations to the Committee. There are two more presentations scheduled for early November.

Program



The speaker for our program today's meeting was Dr. James Olzewski, a local chiropractor. Dr. Olzewski spent 6 years as a missionary in Brazil prior to starting his practice here in Huntsville. He and his wife have seven children. Dr. Olzewski spoke on how to be "healthy" with several references to Biblical passages. He said America has the best health care in the world, but that doesn't make us the healthiest nation. In fact, we are towards the bottom, ranking 69th out of 75 nations in the world.

He also quoted from a Johns Hopkins article which stated that the major cause of death in America is health care.

True health is being free from illness and injury. He said in 27 years, his 7 children had sought medical care only 3 times, and those were due to injuries. Our bodies have a built-in capability to heal themselves, but they do occasionally need help. He demonstrated this by keeping a rubber band tightly around his left index finger for most of his talk. As time went by, it got more and more painful, and towards the end of his talk he finally took it off to get relief.

Dr. Olzewski brought a model of a human spine. He said there are 45 miles of nerves that deliver information between our brains and the rest of the body, and all these go through the spine. Keeping these nerves free of pinching, and treating *early* any pain in the spine is "a huge deal" for true natural healing.

Dr. Olzewski distributed gift cards for a free back X-ray and consultation to anyone who asked for them. He particularly recommended a book entitled, "I've Got Your Back" that was written by a spine surgeon. The message from this book is to rely on the inborn, innate healing rather than "cutting."

Closing

President Vastell gave our speaker a tile with the Optimist Creed, and asked him to draw for our attendance prize. Tom Casteel's name was the first one drawn, and of course Tom was in attendance to take it home.

Jim Berry led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.
