Program

Our speaker this evening was Richard Reynolds,



Director and Principal of the Huntsville Achievement School. The school was started about 60 years ago by the First Baptist Church to provide education for children who don't fit into a "one size fits all" educational

environment. It provides a safe and economical educational alternative for students with learning difficulties caused by Autism, ADHD, Dyslexia and Asperger's Syndrome. The school is primarily for middle-class families who can afford to pay the tuition at a private school. It is the only school of its kind between Nashville and Birmingham.

Mr. Reynolds has been associated with the school for 9 years. He spoke at our Club a year or so ago, at which time he told us the HAS would have to vacate its facility at 406 ½ Governors Drive due to the up-scale real estate development in that area. Tonight, he reported that the HAS is now located in the west wing of the former Westlawn Middle School in West Huntsville. They have been working diligently since Memorial Day to spruce up their new location which has five times the floor area of their old location.

He described the transformation, both of the interior and the exterior of the school's new location. The exterior now has a lawn, a new sidewalk and flowering rose bushes to provide a welcoming vista. They have also painted the interior to paint over the brown "prison colors" with soothing shades of gray and white. Lights fixtures now have all three fluorescent bulbs burning. Some of this work has been done by parents in partial payment of tuition of their children at the school.

There are four grades at the school: Young Elementary, Older Elementary, Middle School and High School. Last year there were 54 kids; next year they hope to have 75. There is one teacher per class; sharp, dedicated people who work for low pay and no benefits, but have a vision and a passion for their students.

Mr. Reynolds answered a few questions yielding the following information:

- Tuition at the school is \$605/month for middle school and elementary school and \$705/month for high school
- The HAS gets no funding from either the State or Huntsville City Schools. They do get support from individuals and organizations like our Club.
- Few of the students who attend HAS ever return to Public Schools; this is primarily due to the intimidating environment at most schools with bullying and hazing.
- He is able to keep up with some of the graduates of HAS, and has known some attend to universities and some to become tax-paying parents with good jobs.
- Statistics say Huntsville is one of the top 3 areas in the Country for the prevalence of Autism, perhaps exceeded only by the Raleigh/Durham Research Triangle in North Carolina.

Closing



Vastell gave our speaker a tile with the Optimist Creed, and asked him to draw for our attendance prize. Dr. Belinda Savage-Edwards was the winner on the first draw. She donated all her winnings to the Club's Childhood Cancer Fund.

President Vastell led the Club in reciting the Optimist Creed to close the meeting.


