### **Program**



Jesse Lang introduced our program for the evening, who was, in fact, his daughter Portia Lang. Portia is the Case Service Coordinator for the Alabama Chapter of the ALS Association, a **ASSOCIATION** nationally affiliated not-for-profit health organization dedicated to fight against ALS (also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease). Portia is a licensed social worker with a Bachelor's Degree from Alabama A & M and a Master's Degree from UA Tuscaloosa. Jesse said his daughter's motto is "If I can help someone along the way, then my living will not be in vain."

Portia is the Care Coordinator for ALS in our part of the state. Portia said her job is to bring whatever relief and information she can to those in our area who have ALS in the northeast part of Alabama. There are special "tools" to help ALS people manage their daily chores (e.g., brushing teeth) without help. She also has access to grants for transportation needs

Portia described Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis disease and the effects it has on a person afflicted with it. Some statistics:

- There are two types of ALS, sporadic (90%) and familial (10 %)
- No two people have the same progression of the disease
- Life expectancy is typically between 2 and 5 years
- Most people are between the ages of 40 and 70 when afflicted
- The disease seems somewhat more prevalent with those who have played football and those in the military
- Approximately 30,000 people in the U. S. are living with the disease at any one time
- Currently, there are about 200 people with ALS in Alabama (10 in Portia's region)

Huntsville is blessed to have an excellent ALS Care Clinic at Crestwood Hospital. At this clinic, in one convenient location are the doctors, therapists, specialists and consultants to serve those with ALS.

Those with ALS have extremely high medical expenses, and the ALS Association needs contributions to help them. The ice-bucket challenge has been used to raise millions of dollars for ALS, and this will be conducted again in August. Another way to contribute is to participate in the annual "Walk to Defeat ALS" event in Huntsville which will be held on October 7 at the HudsonAlpha Institute campus in Research Park.

### Closing

President Eureka gave Portia one of our Optimist Creed tiles and thanked her for her informative presentation. She asked her to draw for the attendance prize. Al Renz won the pot on the first draw. Note: this is the second time Al's won in the past three months.
